	manipulation skills, thinking skills, ethics and values?		
	c. How to employ content expertise to generate explanations,		
	representations, or clarifications? What are the sources of		
	analogies, metaphors, examples, demonstrations, and rephrasing?		
	This programme intends to provide opportunities for teachers teaching		
	similar subject contents to exchange views and practices; develop		
	understandings of the discipline, teaching strategies and curriculum		
	materials for trying out; and to summarize experiences for future		
	practice.
